

Welcome To After-The-Bell

Spring 2017

Our Mission: After-The-Bell provides a supervised after-school program of recreational, social and academic skill-developing activities for Kennett Middle School students. The program is led by community volunteers and provided without charge.

After-The-Bell is an after-school program for students in the Kennett Middle School. The Kennett After-School Association sponsors this program to provide an enjoyable learning experience in a safe environment. After-The-Bell is open to all students of the Kennett Middle School and is free of charge, voluntary, and subject to availability of space and facilities. Feel free to call with any questions or concerns at **(610) 268-5889**, **e-mail us at** <u>afterthebell@kcsd.org</u> **or visit our website - www.afterthebell.org.** After-The-Bell does not discriminate in its educational programs, activities, or employment practices, based on race, color, sex, sexual orientation, disability, age, religion, ancestry, union membership, or any other legally protected classification.

After-The-Bell is offered in three six-week cycles during the school year - Fall, Winter, and Spring - on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 2:35 to 5:00 PM.

Transportation home is provided. Participants receive a snack and relax in the cafeteria before starting the first session at 3:00. Each event requires 1 to 2 hours, depending upon the nature of the activity. If school is canceled or there is an early dismissal, After-The-Bell will not meet.

How to register

- Program registration is limited, and many activities fill the first day of registration.
- Students may register for one, two or three days.
- For each day that they are registered, students must select activities for first and second sessions or a double session.
- Students must return a completed Registration Form, with parent signature, to the After-The-Bell table outside the CAFETERIA no earlier than 7:15 am April 4th, and no later than 3:00 pm on April 6th, 2017.
- Parents, please make sure you sign the Registration Form; registration will not be accepted without Parent/Guardian's signature.
- If you turned in a Registration Form and did not receive an assignment letter by **April 21**st, check the activity assignment posters which will be posted outside the Cafeteria. If your name is not on the list, see Mrs. Doherty Kohl in C106.

Rights and Responsibilities

- A student should take the appropriate time to learn about the activities and must remain in the same activities for the cycle.
- We try to give students their first choice of activity, but maintain the flexibility to choose from their 2nd or 3rd choice if necessary.
- When you receive the letter informing you of the activities assigned, please notify us in writing immediately if your child does not intend to participate. We always have students on a waiting list.
- Students must follow the After-The-Bell Code of Conduct at all times to be able to remain in the After-The-Bell program.
- Any student attending After-The-Bell may request Bus Transportation home at no charge. Students must follow our Code of Conduct while riding on the bus. **Bus service is** provided by After-the-Bell, not the Kennett Consolidated School District.
- Students who are registered for After-The-Bell on a given day must attend their After-The-Bell activities; students may not leave their activities to attend school sports games.
- Some activities are very popular; therefore, if you sign up for a particular activity as your first choice more than once during a cycle, even if your application is received early, you may be scheduled for that activity only once. For example, if Arts and Crafts is your first choice on both Tuesday and Thursday, you may be scheduled for Arts and Crafts on only one of those days.
- After-The-Bell makes every effort to provide the scheduled activities. If an activity is canceled due to inclement weather, facilitator absence, etc., After-The-Bell will provide a substitute activity.

After-The-Bell Code of Conduct

Safety ♦ Respect ♦ Self-Discipline

Upon registering for After-The-Bell, all students and parents agree to this Code of Conduct. It covers how all students must behave in order to attend After-The-Bell activities. These rules apply for all hours. They apply to all locations, at the Middle School, at off-site activities and on any bus.

All students must behave safely and with respect for themselves and for all volunteers, staff and other students.

At the beginning of each cycle, the staff will meet with the students during snack to explain that we expect them to behave properly. This group discussion will be a warning to all students to listen to and follow instructions from the facilitators and staff, to speak only in a respectful manner and follow all school rules.

The cornerstones of our code of conduct are safety, respect, and self-discipline. We promote safety, show respect, and learn self-discipline through:

1) our language, and 2) our actions to others.

We will no longer issue warnings for individual instances of misbehavior. The first time a student misbehaves, his/her parents will be contacted and he/she may be **dismissed from the program immediately.** The decision to allow the student to return during the current cycle or for any future cycle will be determined by the staff of After-The-Bell. Staff may also decide the student must participate in different activities geared to promoting proper behavior. If these changes in activities are not acceptable to the student or parents, the child always has the option of withdrawing from the program for the current cycle.

The following are examples of behaviors which will cause students to be dismissed from After-The-Bell Program immediately!

- Inappropriate language such as lying, put-downs, bad language, swearing, threats, name-calling, or any language which could cause emotional injury to students, staff, or volunteers.
- Inappropriate actions which may cause injury to people or property. This will include insulting gestures, throwing objects at others, pushing, fighting, stealing, and destroying property.
- Showing disrespect by ignoring, disobeying, talking back, or being sarcastic to volunteers or staff.
- Disruptive behavior in the cafeteria, the halls, the activities, or on the bus, which may include continuing to talk when asked to quiet down, continuous and intentional interruption of a volunteer, a member of the staff, or another student.
- Showing disrespect by using cell phones, iPods, CD/MP3 players, iBooks/Kindles/other electronic readers will be allowed during certain times/activities however, ATB is not responsible should there be a mishap or loss of this property.
- Disrespect of school property, such as touching the teacher's desk, SmartBoards, whiteboard, books, displays or equipment.

By signing the Registration Form both student and parent are stating the following:

I understand that After-The-Bell is a completely voluntary and free after-school program that is provided by volunteers and community donations. I may choose at any time to remove my child from the program for the current cycle. My child is expected to behave in a safe and respectful manner when attending After-The- Bell. If my child breaks any rules, I will be contacted by the staff. I understand that my child may then be dismissed from his/her choice of activity and/or the entire program for misbehavior.

AFTER-THE-BELL What makes us tick?

The Kennett After-School Association (KASA) was founded by a group of citizens acting in partnership with the United Way of Chester County and the Kennett Church of the Advent to meet the needs of our Kennett Middle School children. The program has grown considerably, but the program is still run by just two full-time staff members. Kennett Area School District partners with KASA to provide facilities for the program in our beautiful Kennett Middle School.

Our middle school students are a diverse and enthusiastic group who need a safe environment to help them develop mature interests and a strong sense of self. Participation in the array of activities provided throughout our three cycles each year offer many opportunities to build life skills in a nurturing after-school environment.

Close to 200 volunteers, including retired and active teachers, local professionals, senior citizens, as well as high school and college students from Kennett and the surrounding area, share their time and interests with students. Volunteers lead or assist in activities, contact other volunteers and create new activities, distribute snacks, accompany students to offsite activities, and often mentor students along the way.

Community financial support comes from the United Way, foundations, commerce and industry, and public contributions. We neither receive nor seek any tax payer money to run the program.

As you can see, we depend heavily on the generous support of the Kennett Community and YOU, our parents, through your volunteering, donations, and enthusiastic support!

After-The-Bell is Free But it still costs money to run.

Even though we have very low overhead and our programs are run by volunteers, it still costs nearly \$200 per participant for each After-The-Bell cycle. Transportation, program supplies, insurance and staff salaries add up quickly!

We count on the generosity of the United Way, local foundations, and generous individuals to help cover our operating expenses. We are an independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit and do not receive any financial support from the Kennett Consolidated School District.

Tips for a Successful After-The-Bell Registration

- Registration is on a first-come-first-served basis. Incomplete registration forms cannot be processed, causing students to miss the opportunity to be included in their desired classes. Activities fill quickly.
- Please complete all parts of the form including the student information page, the activity selection page, and the medical information page (please note ATB does not have access to school medical records). Registration forms must be signed by the parents/guardians and student. Students will not be accepted into the After-The-Bell program without a parent/guardian signature on the Registration Form.
- Students may register for one, two, or all three days of a cycle. Students must select two activities each day from 3-4:00pm and from 4-5:00pm OR a double session from 3-5:00pm. Students must participate in the entire program from 3:00-5:00pm on any day they attend After-The-Bell.
- Students <u>must</u> list their 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choices for activities.
 After-The-Bell makes every effort to provide students with their first choice of activity; however, due to the volume of students involved in After-The-Bell, that is not always possible.
- Be sure to match the days you want to come with the activities
 available that day. Example: If Tasty Bites is offered on Thursday, do not
 put it in a Tuesday slot. Review the At a Glance Page.
- **Example**: If you really want Tennis (a double) put it in your 1st Choice slot, if you like Jr. Engineers (a double) put it in your 2nd Choice. If you would be happy with Photography (single session) followed by Fun with Flowers (single session) put it in your 3rd Choice. (see Thursday example).

- **Circle** the days you would like to attend. Cross out the days you are not attending.
- Write down 3 activity names of your interests on these days for each session.
- If choosing a double session, write the activity name across both lines, double sessions run for 2 hours (3:00 - 5:00).

Students must bring a note, signed by a parent/guardian to the After-The-Bell office located in C106 notifying personnel that the student will not attend scheduled activities that day.

When advance notice is not possible, please email **AfterTheBell@kcsd.org** or call **610-268-5889**. If for any reason you can't call, please send a note the next day explaining the absence. A student who is absent or suspended from school for the day may not attend After-The-Bell that day. Students must stay for both sessions on any day they register. Students will not be permitted to change activities after the cycle begins! It is expected that all participating students will follow existing school rules and our code of conduct during the After-The-Bell program. Students who choose not to follow the rules may be dismissed. Parents will be informed of any discipline problems which may lead to the removal of their child from the program for that cycle. It is important that you fill in completely your son/daughter's registration form on both sides.

REGISTRATION: April 4 through April 6, 2017. Parents will be notified of activity assignments by letters sent home by April 21, 2017. Please notify us in writing before activities begin if your child will not be participating in the assigned activities.
